

DHS SMS Mobile Terms of Service

Program Name: SUN Bucks Program SMS

Introduction

The Hawaii State Department of Human Services (DHS) and its authorized agent may use text messages to advise customers about Summer Electronic Benefits Transfer (SEBT) benefits and to convey important notices. Text messages to your mobile phone is one of the primary methods that may be used to contact you regarding benefits.

The DHS SEBT SMS service will allow DHS and its authorized agents to communicate with customers about program participation and critical updates about the process via text message.

The phone number you provide at the time of signing up for the service is the number that will be used to send text messages regarding benefits. If the phone number you provide is not valid, your phone number will be marked as invalid and we will cease all communications using text messaging.

By opting in to receive DHS SEBT SMS services, you expressly consent to all such methods of communications regarding this service.

Canceling the Service

You can cancel the DHS SEBT SMS service at any time by calling the SUN Bucks Customer Service toll-free at 1-888-975-SEBT(7328) or utilizing the "Contact Us" button at <https://sunbucks.dhs.hawaii.gov>. We will send you a confirmation that you have been unsubscribed. After this, you will no longer receive SMS messages from DHS.

If you want to join again, just call the SUN Bucks Customer Service toll-free at 1-888-975-SEBT(7328) or utilize the "Contact Us" button at <https://sunbucks.dhs.hawaii.gov> and we will start sending SMS messages to you again.
